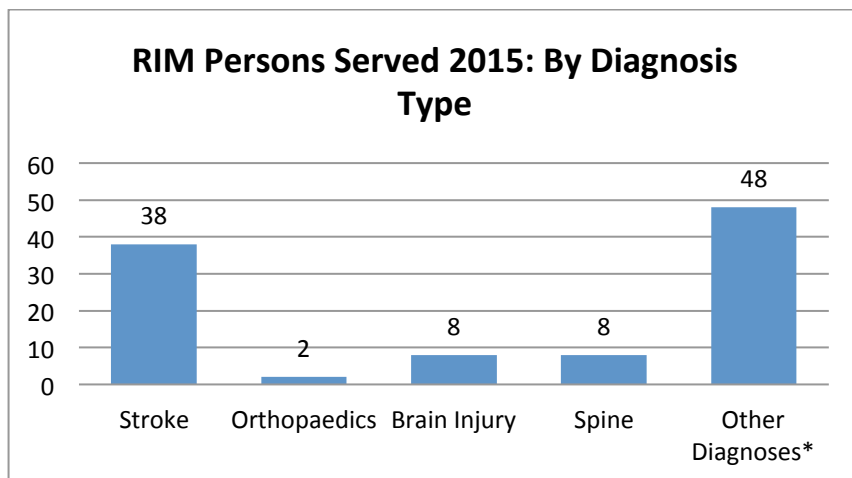

2015 PERSON SERVED BY DIAGNOSIS



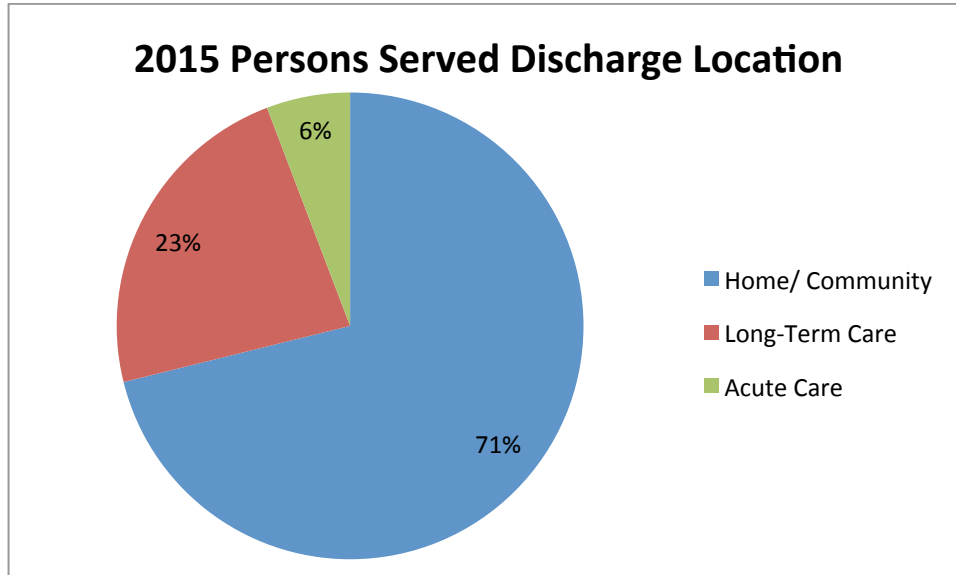

- CMC has the most extensive continuum of care for persons with brain injury in the Northwest
- Patients discharged from the Rehab Institute of Montana rate their General Care higher than the National average
- Length of Stay at the Rehab Institute of Montana is less than the National average while providing great outcomes

- More of our patients return to community settings and are in charge of their own primary healthcare after discharge than regional and national benchmarks
- Fewer of our patients have unplanned re-hospitalizations than national benchmarks
