# **Walk-in Lab Services**

## Alanine Aminotransferase (ALT) \$7.50

Increased levels of this enzyme are associated with inflammation or injury to liver cells. This enzyme may be ordered by a physician to rule out an individual patient's sensitivity to cholesterol-lowering drugs.

## Aspartate Aminotransferase (AST) \$7.50

Increased levels of this enzyme are associated with inflammation or injury to liver cells and injury to kidney, muscle and heart. This enzyme may be ordered by a physician-to rule out an individual patient's sensitivity to cholesterol-lowering drugs.

## Blood Count (CBC)

Screens for cell abnormalities and evidence of medical conditions. Most commonly used to screen for infection, anemia and other blood disorders such as leukemia.

## **Blood Type**

Provides information on your blood group–A, B or 0. Indicates if Rhesus Antigen (Rh) is positive or negative.

### Lipid Panel\*

\$20

Helps monitor risks of developing heart disease by measuring lipids and lipid-protein complexes, cholesterol HDL, LDL and triglycerides.

#### Cardiac Risk Panel\*

\$65

- Lipid Panel
- Ultrasensitive CRP: Indicates ongoing inflammation that may increase the risk of heart disease and stroke.
- Homocysteine: Measures the risk for developing clogged arteries, heart attack and stroke.

# Comprehensive Chemistry Panel\* \$30

Gives an overall picture of your health, from indicating how organ systems are functioning to levels of vital minerals and proteins. Does not include lipid panel.

## **Glucose Test for Blood Sugar\***

Glucose test measures your sugar level, indicating whether your sugar metabolism is working properly.

# Hemoglobin A1C

\$25

Measures the average sugar level over a three-month period.

# Hepatitis A (Hepatitis A Antibody IgM) \$45

Useful in diagnosing recent acute or subclinical hepatitis A infection. First Lab is required by law to report positive results to the State Department of Health.

# Hepatitis B (Hepatitis B Surface Antigen) \$35

Useful in diagnosing recent acute or chronic hepatitis B infection; First Lab is required by law to report positive results to the State Department of Health.

# Hepatitis C (Hepatitis C Antibody)

\$45

Detects past or current hepatitis C infections. First Lab is required by law to report positive results to the State Department of Health.

#### **Mononucleosis Test**

\$20

Indicates the presence of an Epstein Barr virus infection.

# **Pregnancy Test, Blood**

\$25

Indicates pregnancy status, positive or negative.

# Prostate Specific Antigen Blood Test (PSA)

\$45

Measures prostate specific antigen levels in your blood. Elevated levels can indicate prostate cancer.

## **TSH-Thyroid Screen**

\$40

Screens for thyroid disorders.

## Urinalysis

\$20

Helps indicate overall wellness from urinary tract infections to systemic illness to kidney disorders.

# Occult Blood Screen (Fecal Occult Blood)

\$20

A sample of stool tested for invisible blood indicating colon disorders.

## **CRP**, Ultrasensitive

\$30

Indicates ongoing inflammation that may increase the risk of heart disease and stroke.

## Free T4

\$35

Measures the level of T4 hormones available for use by the thyroid. High levels of Free T4 indicate overactive thyroid and-low levels of Free T4 indicate underactive thyroid.

### INR

\$15

Monitors the effectiveness of coumadin therapy.

#### **Vitamin D**

\$35

Vitamin D aids in the absorption of calcium, helping to form and maintain strong bones.
